Several years ago, we offered an in-  
troduutory Docking and Marina Pro-  
cedures class, and it received rave  
reviews. So we're repeating it this  
year, and we've added a second day  
for advanced topics.

Our instructor is Sandi MacLeod,  
senior US Sailing Certified Instructor  
with more than a decade of teaching  
experience.

Sandi has made multiple trips across  
the ocean, including the 1997 Trans-  
Pac and several deliveries. She has

sailed extensively  
on the West  
Coast, in British  
Columbia, the San  
Juans, the Carib-  
bean, the Florida  
Keys on the East  
Coast and near Tahiti in the South  
Pacific. Sandi was the first woman  
instructor certified by US Sailing as  
a Coastal Passagemaking instructor,  
and is one of only two women cur-  
rently certified to do so.





(Docking class, con't)

The class will consist of a lecture followed by an on-the-water-demonstration. All participants will receive written materials to take home.

The classes are free to all paid-up 2004 members of the Potter Yachters. Non-members may join the club for \$24 (per family) on the day of the classes and attend the classes at no further charge.

Please bring a bag lunch for both days. We will take a short lunch break.

You do not need to have your boat there to participate. However, it would be very valuable to have your boat so you can practice on our own after the class ends. There are plenty of empty slips at the Richmond Marina for practicing.

The class will be several hours long, so it's best to launch your boat and put it in a slip before the class starts.

If you want to bring your boat but you don't want to rent a slip, we recommend you rig your boat and leave it in the parking lot at the ramp. Launch after the class ends. You should have about 3 hours for practicing.

There is a \$5 fee for launching. Slips are \$15 plus key deposit. The Harbormaster's office opens at 9 am; their phone is 510-236-1013.

**Saturday, March 6th , 11:00 am  
Basic Docking and Marina Procedures**

The "Basic" Class will cover skills such as :

- preparation before docking
- choosing your docking approach
- marina traffic patterns and rules
- communication between skipper and crew,
- correct use of dock lines
- approaches and departures to and from upwind, downwind and side wind slips,
- using ranges to steer in currents and side-winds
- going forward and backing up under power,
- tight radius turns,
- what to do if your outboard quits, and other common emergencies

**Sunday, March 7th, 10:00 am  
Advanced Docking and Marina Procedures.**

The "Advanced" class will cover skills such as:

- Single-handed docking and departure under power
- special considerations when motoring into and out of downwind or strong side current slips (like Ayala Cove)
- "parallel parking" in short spaces on side ties
- use of spring lines
- docking under sail power
- back and fill maneuver for turning slowly in a tight space
- additional topics

#### Elections:

Dory Taylor volunteered as Newsletter Editor and was elected. Judy Blumhorst was elected as Education Captain by Acclamation. Mike Westfield was appointed as Web Master.

Discussion on held on Membership Dues: Stay at \$24? Lowering to \$20 or \$10? The majority consensus was to keep it at \$24.

Suggestion how to spend the Dues surplus: Trophies & Plaques for regattas? Education programs? Parties, BBQ's? Donation to educational programs sponsored by OYC? Donate cleats to City of Oakland for launch ramps???? Markers, lines, floats, etc. for regattas? Non-sailing social gatherings? Group campsite at lakes?

Dave Norris reminded everyone of the South Bay Opening Day on April 2nd. He also showed members the new Coast Guard Auxiliary Vessel Examination stickers, and urged all members to obtain a Safety Inspection.

The Lake Yosemite Sailing Association will hold a regatta in May at Lake Merced. It was suggested that Lake Merced is more suitable for P-15's only. Leroy Falk commented that Merced is indeed a small lake but is adequate for P-19's.

Suggestions for Club Sails: Catalina, channel Island, Lake Millerton with Southern California Potters Group, Whiskey Town, Lake Huntington, Black Butte Lake, Delta, Loch Lomond, Tomales Bay, Redwood City, Eagle Lake, Woodward Res., Bruno Island, SF Bay, Lundborg Landing, Monterey Bay, Lake McClure, and the Estuary. Officers will meet to formulate Sail events.

Rich McDevitt reported excellent attendance at 2003 club sails. Going to 1 major event monthly and having unofficial weekly sails seemed to work well.

Judy Blumhorst queried members regarding repeating the Cruisers' challenge. Response was unanimously positive.

Rich McDevitt suggested we should hold another 'Potters only' regatta.

Suggestions were solicited for our web site. Greg Yu suggested that we change the access code and password to the 'members only' area of our web site periodically.

Dory Taylor shared ideas of modifications & hardware to help skippers with medical conditions. He and Jerry Barrilleaux will come up with suggestions and recommendations.
