### COMMODORE'S LOG

Last Sail: Saturday, March 7, Ballena Bay, Alameda to South Beach Marina, San Francisco

Those attending this sail were David & Candy Hogan (#261), John & Barbara Simpson (#266), Don & Dee Bernreuter (#817), John & Anne Ockes (#1060), Bill & Freda Sprietsma (#1205), Rob & Bruce McClain (#1168), Bruce Hood and Kathryn Kimberly (#1241), Scott Reuter (#1253), Jac Robinson (#1372), Wendell & Marion Spence (#191), and Bill Day and Gigi Cobb (#363).

This sail went off just as planned!!! The weather was cloudy to overcast but warm for March. Since there was no wind in the morning, our entire fleet motored most of the way across the Bay. We sailed around the breakwater in front of the marina and found plenty of space to dock at their long guest dock. For an overnight tie-up, the charge is .35¢ per foot. This would be a great spot to sail to for an overnight stay and a San Francisco waterfront adventure

Our next stop was the Java House Restaurant which overlooked the guest dock and next to pier 40. Good stable food at reasonable prices. While finishing lunch, the good old westerlie came up--10 to 15 knots. This gave us a fast run "wing-on-wing" sail back to Alameda. The small launch ramp was crowded and the pull-outs were slow. Barbara and Candy had time to make friends with at least one unhappy power boater at the ramp.

Next Sail: Sunday, April 12, Martinez Marina to the Mothball Fleet in Suisun Bay

We'll plan to sail from the Martinez Marina across the Carquinez Strait past the Port of Benicia and Army Point then under the Benicia-Martinez Bridge up to the old naval mothball fleet. This will be a 6 to 7 mile round trip sail. The tide will change about 1:15 pm. so we'll have the tide with us both ways. Bring along a picnic lunch for on-board dining. Perhaps after the sail we'll stop for Cajun food or even a pizza. Plan to have your reefing lines rigged as the Strait has been known to be a little breezy at times in April.

Skippers meeting 10:00 am. and launch & in the water by 10:30 am. Directions: From Route 680, turn off at Marina Vista and drive east. Turn right on Ferry Street where you'll pass the AMTRAK Station and railroad tracks. Turn right on Embarcadero which leads to the Martinez Yacht Harbor and launch ramp. If you're coming in from Route 4, turn north on Alhambra Avenue with a short right on Marina Vista then left on Ferry Street.

### And The Following Sail: Sunday, April 26, "Opening Day on San Francisco Bay"



We'll launch early, between 9:30-10:00 am because of the heavy boat traffic that is expected. Then we will try to sail as a group from Sausalito to Ayala Cove at Angel Island. Since the parade of boats is counter-clockwise around the Bay and mostly one-way traffic thru Raccoon Strait, it is recommended to sail/motor around the island to the Cove. There is a charge to use the dock but free to sail your boat onto the beach. Meet on the grassy area for our picnic lunch. There is a snack bar near the dock for fast food. Be aware that there may be some yachties in the area with water balloons. If time, we will hike to the top of the island to view the Bay and the hundreds of boats that will be on the water.

There are two places to launch your boat. One place is the public launch ramp on Turney Street that is between Zack's and Yet Wah Restaurants. Check out the parking first on Locust Street behind the railroad caboose and box cars before launching. The other place is at Clipper Yacht Harbor which is next to Caruso's Sportfishing and located at the foot of Harbor Drive just north of the Corp of Engineers facilities. There is a nominal charge to use the launch ramp but there is plenty of parking. It is recommended to use the north entrance from Route 101 to Sausalito to get to Bridgeway Boulevard and the launch ramps.

Yes, it is time to attend our annual business meeting, luncheon, and election of officers. We will meet upstairs on the main deck about 11:30 am. prior to the noon luncheon. We'll be ordering from the regular brunch menu. If you cannot attend this event, send your suggestions and ballot to the commodore.


